
We believe in the power of partnership and collaboration and that everyone should have access to the Club experience and the opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive.

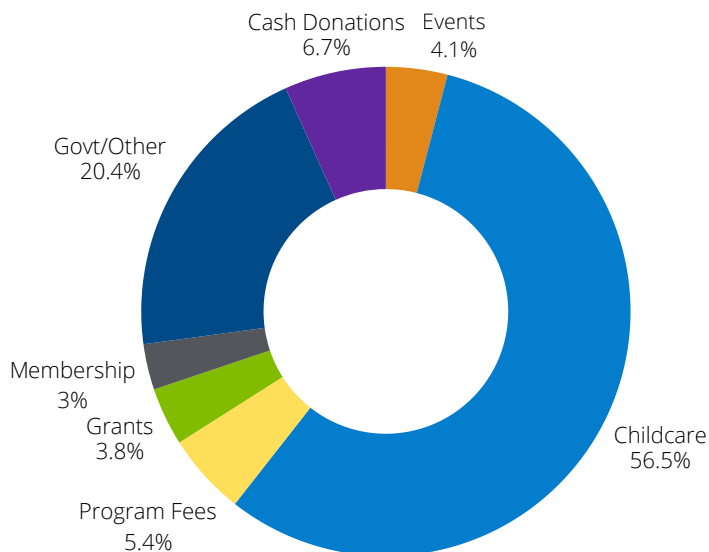

Staff Values



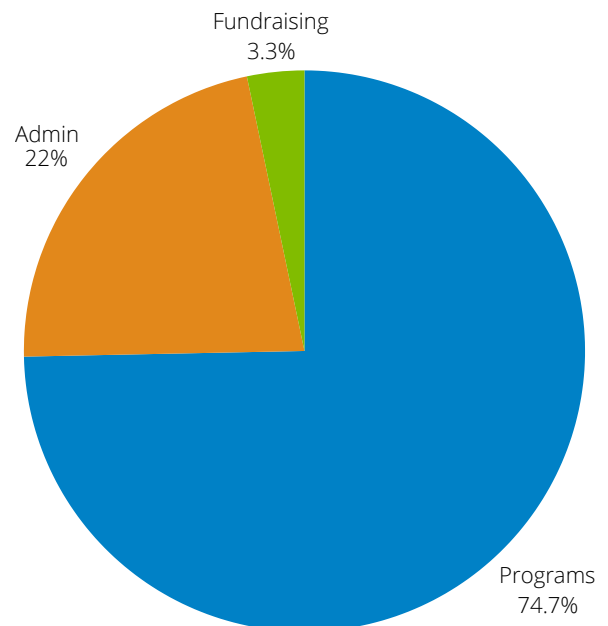
FINANCIAL STATEMENT

WHAT WE DO

Preschool

Offered a hands-on curriculum for children ages 2.9-5 by learning through play, practicing social-emotional skills, and experiencing STEAM projects, in a safe and caring environment, licensed by the Department of Early Education & Care.

Youth Aquatics

Emphasized water safety, education, and fun through competitive teams, clinics, and swim lessons from infancy to 18 years old. Ludlow High School's swim team also used the Club facility.

Youth Athletics

Taught youth ages 3-18 the importance of hard work, teamwork, perseverance, competition, and humility while developing fine and gross motor skills, balance, and stamina. Opportunities included soccer, t-ball, coach-pitch, volleyball, track, cross-country, and basketball.

Community Events & Programs

Provided free or low-cost activities for youth and families to connect, explore, and learn:

- Boys & Girls Club Day for Kids
- Floating Pumpkin Patch
- Rag Shag & Trunk or Treat
- Open Game Nights
- First Aid & CPR Certification Classes
- Slide into Summer Safety with PV Financial Group

STEAM

Incorporated science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics projects into childcare, preschool, and Summer Fun programs. Additionally, created after school STEAM opportunities for youth at Harris Brook Elementary School, and hosted various one-day and/or short programs for community members to enjoy games, 3D printing classes, video game tournaments, and more.

How Great Clubs Apply Our Youth Development Principles

The **Five Key Elements for Positive Youth Development** are crucial to an optimal Club Experience. When Clubs create an **optimal Club Experience**, they:

- 1 Provide a safe, positive environment
- 2 Provide access to fun and a sense of belonging
- 3 Provide access to supportive relationships
- 4 Provide meaningful opportunities and expectations
- 5 Provide formal and informal recognition

Adult Fitness & Membership

Provided social, fitness, and recreational opportunities to adults, seniors, and families. Offered classes such as yoga, POUND, Qi Gong, aquacise, basketball, pickleball, Senior Bootcamp, and personal training sessions.

Before & After School Care & Summer Fun Program

Provided youth in grades K-8 opportunities to develop healthy lifestyles, positive relationships, self-confidence, and a sense of belonging. The Club offered a safe place for youth to participate in physical activities, educational programs, anti-bullying workshops, electrical and safety workshops, and receive homework help and more throughout the school year and over the summer. Programs are licensed by the Department of Early Education and Care.

The Troubling Odds

While there is enormous potential within every child, today's young people face troubling odds:

- The **child poverty rate more than doubled** to 12.4% in one year.¹
- In 2023, 20% of U.S. youth from **12 to 17 years old reported suffering a major depressive episode in the last year**, compared to 15% in 2022.²
- Between 3 and 6 p.m., **nearly 8 million youth are alone, unsupervised and potentially unsafe.**³

At Boys & Girls Clubs, we open doors to Future Ready leaders who will propel our country forward.

Our Impact

Youth shouldn't have to face these challenges alone. Research shows high-quality youth development programs, like those offered by Boys & Girls Clubs, improve youth outcomes, including school attendance, avoidance of risky behaviors, civic engagement, and graduation rates. Our youth outcome data demonstrate proof of this impact:

Club youth are **twice as confident** as their peers about knowing what education or training is needed for their careers.⁴

97%

of Boys & Girls Club teens **expect to graduate high school**, while only 87% graduate nationwide.⁵

92%

of Club teens say they have an adult to talk to at the Club when they need help, compared to 40% who say they have one at school.⁶
